Making sense of living in God's world needs God's wisdom

- 1. Read Job 28:1-11
 - What things of value are these verses about?
- 2. Where can they be found?
- 3. In what ways are human achievements impressive?

Living life to the full is not about knowing why things happen, but instead knowing the God who knows why things happen

- **4. Read 28:12-28** What thing of value is now being discussed?
- 5. How does it compare with the precious things discussed in the earlier verses?
- 6. Where can it be found? (v28)
- 7. What does it mean to 'fear' the Lord?
- 8. And so what is the answer to the question of v12? Is it found in relationship? Or knowledge? Or old age?
- **9.** Read the subtitle statement above. This might be the big idea of the book of Job. Can you understand the point? Do you accept it? How helpful is it?

- 10. Read Job 29:1-5 What is Job longing for? Why is that a good thing?
- 11. Read Job 30:9f. What is Job's current experience?
 How does it point towards the sufferings Jesus endured in his incarnation?
- 12. Read Job 31:1-32:1 Why is Job ending like this? How does this finally silence the three friends?
- 13. Is the book of Job making good sense to you yet?

Apply these things to your life

- 14. Are there times when you've let God disagree with you? What are the things you'd want to disagree with him about?
- 15. How can we support one another in:
 - a. Persevering through suffering?
 - b. Taking holiness seriously?
- 16. According to 1 Cor 1:18-25 what is God's wisdom? How is this different from what Jews or Greeks expect or desire?
- 17. According to Colossians 2:2-3 where is wisdom and knowledge found?
