# Home Group Notes Testing Times 5 - God or Mammon Mark 10:17-31

Have you ever argued about money with a friend or a relative? Have you tried retail therapy?!! Does it work?

## Read Mark 10:17-22

- 1. Jesus tells us that we receive the Kingdom of God as a child in v15. How does the man in our reading show that he is eager to become a disciple of Jesus (v 17)? How did this man think he could gain eternal life?
- 2. What might we think we need to **do** to be good enough to inherit eternal life? If only God is truly good what are the implications for the man and us?
- 3. Jesus summarises the law to the man. How does the man answer in v 20? What had totally escaped this man?
- 4. How do we confidently react when we look at our own morality compared to that of others v 20?
- 5. Jesus recognised the man's sincerity but puts the finger on his problem v 21. How much of our security is vested in money, possessions, status or position? Is it a problem for us as it was for this man? What is the only way to life says Jesus?
- 6. What does Jesus mean by treasure in heaven? Sacrifice for Jesus is not loss but investment!!
- 7. And the man's reaction to this in v 22? Is following Jesus too hard for us?

None of us can stand on our own merits.

# Read Mark 10:23-27

8. Why were the disciples perplexed and shocked by Jesus' response to wealth in vs 23, 26?

- 9. Does Jesus mean that poor people get into the Kingdom more easily? Are all less well off people necessarily less materialistic?
- 10. Why is wealth such a potential danger to faith in Jesus vs24 & 25? Is Jesus condemning wealth? See Matt 27:57 and Mk 14:3-9.
- 11. The disciples at last ask the right Q in v 26! So what can we do to be saved? There are two answers. What are they? (cf Acts 16:30-31). *It's Amazing Grace again!!*

### Read Mark 10:28-31

- 12. If what we do has no bearing on salvation is self-sacrifice ultimately worthless? vs 28
- 13. What does Jesus call on our lives take priority over? vs 29
- 14. But what do we ultimately gain as we give up our 'nets' and `wealth' for Jesus?
- 15. But be prepared because it's going to lead possibly to difficulties `with persecutions' vs 30
- The way God evaluates our lives is reversed vs 31.
   Discipleship is about following Jesus which involves suffering and service.

# **Prayer Points**

- -Pray that we will not allow anything to get in the way of us entering the Kingdom of God.
- -Pray for those who are obsessed by wealth, whether rich or poor.
- -Pray for a generous, gracious heart towards others.
- -Pray for those who are persecuted for their faith in Jesus.
- -Pray that we will be people who are true disciples of Jesus.
- -Pray that as a church and as individuals we will be good stewards of what God has given us.
